

CONDITIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP ACCEPTANCE

College of Agriculture and Life Sciences

The following information has been compiled to provide details on the procedures and regulations regarding the academic scholarship you have been awarded by the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. Please review this information carefully and for future reference.

1. This scholarship is applicable only to students enrolled in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and is not transferable to another college. However, you may switch majors within the college and retain the scholarship.
2. This scholarship is for the 2018-19 academic year.
3. Scholarship payments are made in equal installments at the beginning of each academic semester for which the scholarship is granted. The scholarship is issued in the form of a credit on your semester bill.
4. Scholarship recipients who are also recipients of federal and/or other financial aid based on need are reminded that total aid from all sources may not exceed cost less expected family contribution. Should this occur, a scholarship might have to be reduced or withdrawn in order to comply with federal regulations. If this is necessary, however, the financial aid package will be adjusted to the student's maximum allowable benefit. If scholarships awarded on merit, non-financial need, result in over payment of charges for a semester, a refund will be issued to the student.
5. Scholarship recipients are expected to maintain full-time status (at least 12 credit hours in a regular semester) unless advised otherwise by the Office of Academic Programs in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. The scholarship will be withdrawn and repayment required if less than a full-time load is taken during an academic semester.
6. Scholarship recipients are expected to maintain high qualities of personal character and to conform to all University regulations. Recipients who are placed on either disciplinary or Honor Court probation will have their scholarships withdrawn during the probationary period.
7. This scholarship may be publicized in your home community if you wish.
8. A thank-you letter of appreciation is **required, due by Friday, October 5, 2018** and will be collected through the Scholarship Central system. Use the guidelines for preparing letters of appreciation as a guide.
